

This task was thought by four of our researchers, Filipa, Lia, Carlos (collaborator) and José (collaborator), who will work on it in the future. This group is responsible for the methodological aspects of the cartography production and will prepare the field work that will take place between April and July 2012.

After this meeting it was decided that the first phase of field work should include an historical research, concerning historic cartography of the region of Almada. This research will generate output maps that will afterwards integrate information from the Critical Alphabetization and Histories of Life tasks, in collaboration with other team researches. The data for the analysis will embrace multiple aspects of these communities such as social, cultural, geographic, political, marine, fauna, and flora. The final goal is to integrate inputs from several sources and methodologies to produce output maps. The core of the analysis will be on the evolution of the population movement and on its consequences, regarding the study of the visible and invisible boundaries of each community.

The cartography will be supported by a Geographical Information System that will integrate spatial and alphanumeric data, collected during the bibliographic research and the field work, which will take place after April 2, one day a week, one hour per day, with members of the research community and, if necessary, with members of both communities - Fishing and Bairro.
